

"This offers nearly limitless design options with the higher durability of fiberglass."

Somerset works closely with a handful of trusted suppliers to find cost-effective materials to create lasting, everyday works of art. While some manufacturers outsource components in the production process, Somerset fabricates all wood parts on site.

The team of about 15 individuals at Somerset is made up of fabrication artisans and a sales staff with thorough knowledge of production. Many Somerset employees began woodworking in the mill, aiding to the depth of the company's background. The staff is hands on and accessible to ensure that customer's wants are fully accommodated.

Designs are available in sizes up to 40 inches in diameter and 40 feet in length. If a client requires a more custom design, scale drawings can be prepared for approval.
